





Cuppy



How it works


We used to play this game when I was at school and loved it. When we played there were often up to 20 or more of us at any one time but I would not recommend any more than 12 as an absolute maximum.

The coach (or a goalkeeper if you have an odd number of players) stands in the goal with a supply of balls and throws one up in the air for all the teams to try and gain possession and shoot on goal.



At this stage players have to shoot quickly as the area is crowded so encourage players to take first time shots.

If a shot by the blue player hits a green player before going in then the goal is awarded to the green team.



When a team scores a goal they are through to the next round of the Cup, standing behind the goal out of the way.

As the teams get fewer, a little more passing is possible between teammates. The team who are left without a goal are then out of the Cup and all the other teams are back in to compete in the next round. When only two teams are left in the final, they play first to score three goals to win the Cup.

Possible changes

You could have four teams of three with a group of twelve or play two teams at a time as semi-finals and then have a 3rd/4th place final and a 1st/2nd place final like they do in the World Cup.

As kids we also used to play it individually if there wasn't that many of us but it could sometimes take a while with players sat out for long periods.
