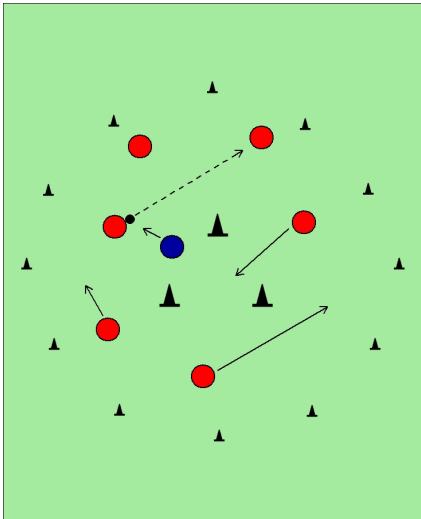




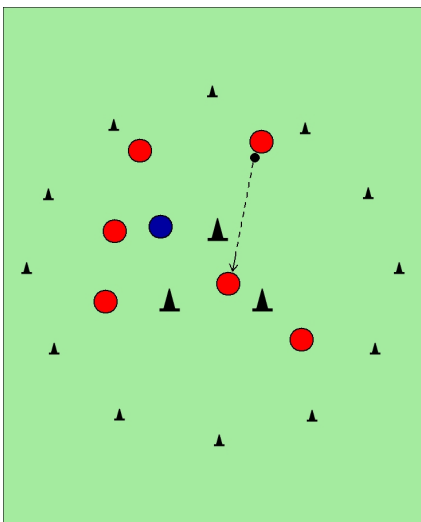
Bermuda triangle



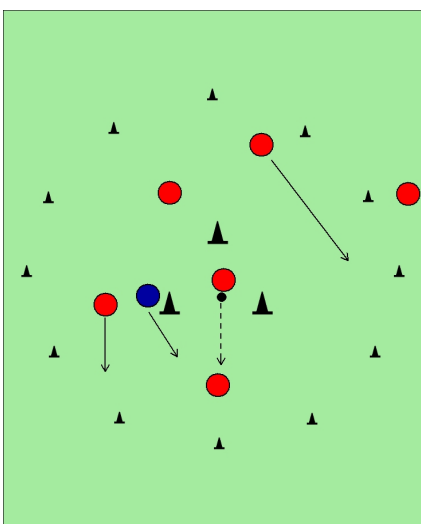
How it works

Start with 5/6 red players against a blue defender. Only the red players are allowed to go inside the central triangle.

The red players try to keep possession of the ball.



The red players have to try and pass the ball into the central triangle for one of them to control. If they achieve this, that red player 'disappears' out of the game and stands outside the circle.



A different red player continues the game by passing the ball in from the central triangle.

If the blue defender intercepts or tackles the ball and kicks it out of the area, then the red players must start again and all players come back into the game. This also happens if the red players allow the ball to go out of the circular playing area by mistake.

The last player has to dribble the ball from the centre, around any outside cone and back into the middle to finish the game and have all players disappear inside the Bermuda Triangle.

Possible changes

Play with two blue defenders to add greater challenge.

Players are only allowed two touches on the ball.
