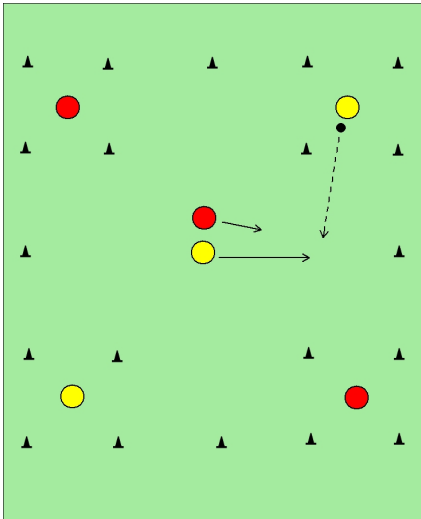




Corner to corner

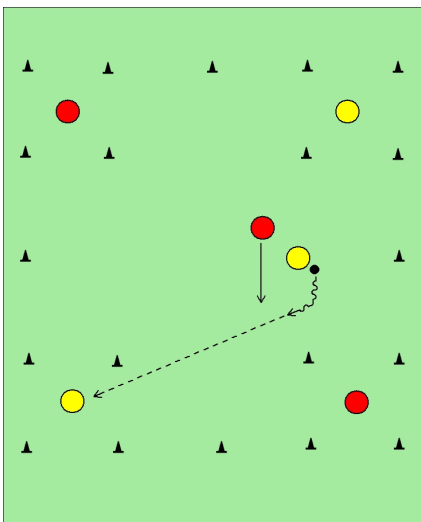


How it works

The four players in each corner square must stay within that area and need those of the same colour need to be opposite to each other.

Possession starts in one of the corners and that colour team have to try and keep possession of the ball for as many passes as possible.

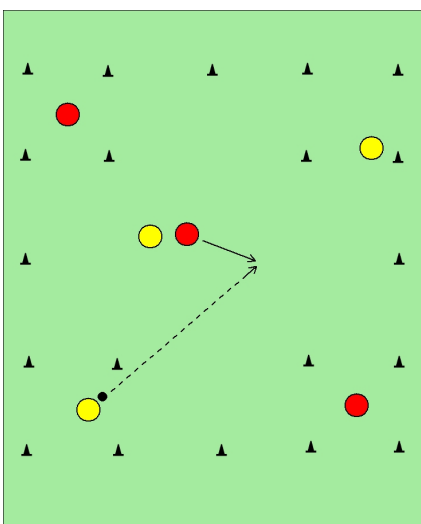
The ball can be passed to the central player, as shown in the diagram, or it can be passed diagonally across the playing area from one corner player to another.



This central player can pass the ball back to the same player if under a lot of pressure from the opposing player. For this they would score one point for each pass made.

However, if they can turn and pass to the player in the opposite corner then they earn ten points to add to their score.

The yellow team continue passing to each other to build up as many points as possible.



If the yellow team lose control of the ball and it goes outside the playing area then the game is restarted with a pass from one of the red corner players.

If the red team can win possession, as shown in the diagram, the player must continue the game by passing to one of the corner players, earning one point to start a new total.

Change roles after a few games to have different central players.

Both teams attempt to beat previous best scores of their own and of the opposition.

Possible changes

If a team go on to make a total of 50/100 points then one of the opposing corner players is allowed into the middle to help them win possession.
