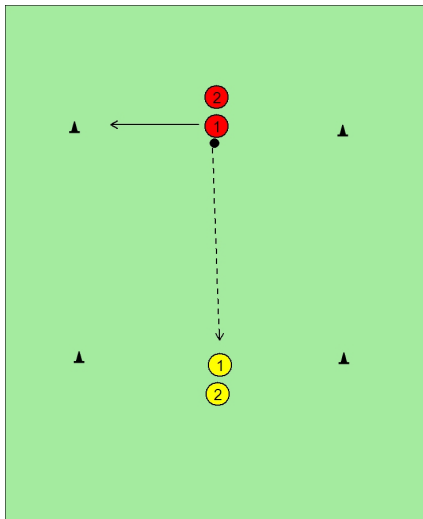


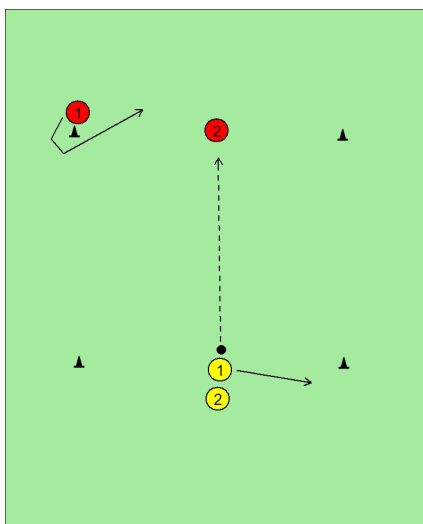


Gridlock



How it works

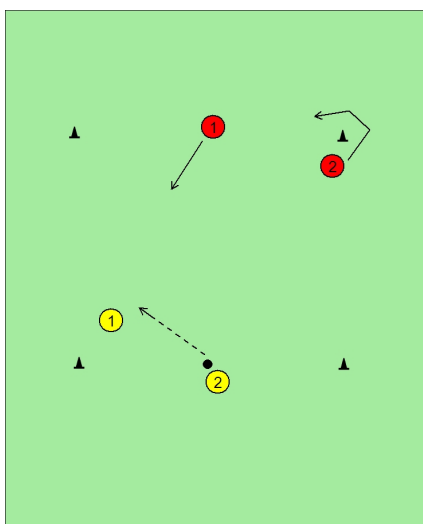
Red player 1 starts by passing the ball to Yellow Player 1 and then runs around either cone at their end of the grid.



Yellow Player 1 controls the ball and passes it back to Red Player 2.

Yellow Player 1 then runs around either cone at their end of the grid.

This pass and move sequence continues with Red Player 2 passing to Yellow Player 2 and so on.



On a signal from the coach, this passing sequence stops and a 2 v 2 game begins with the team in possession of the ball becoming the attackers.

The yellow team scores by passing the ball to knock over either of the cones at the opposite end of the grid (break the gridlock).

The red team attempt to prevent this from happening or try to win possession of the ball to score themselves.

The game is over as soon as the ball leaves the grid. When all groups have finished, start them all with the passing sequence again for another game.

Possible changes

A player must stop the ball anywhere in line between the two cones in order to score a point.

First time passing only during the opening pass and move sequence.
