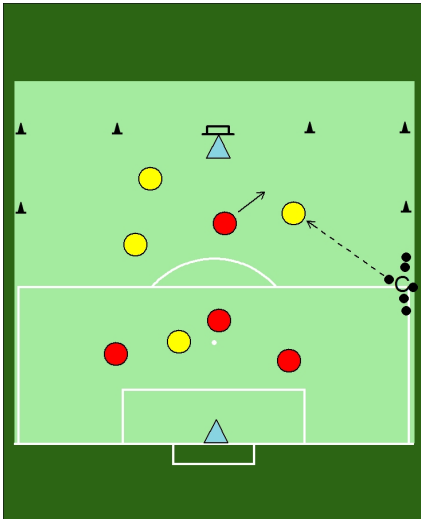




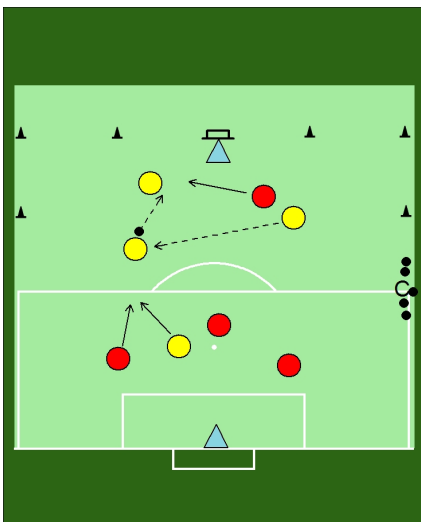
Battle zones



How it works

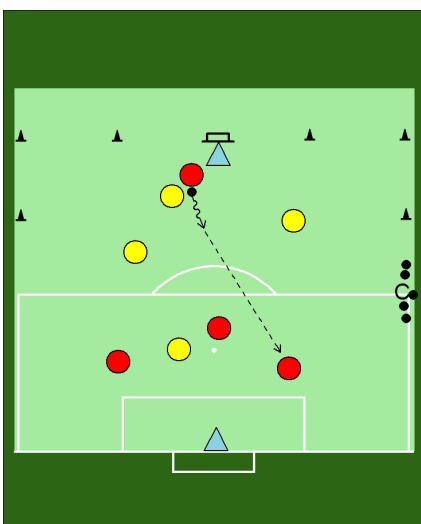
The two goals and the two 'battle zones' need to be of fairly equal size if possible.

The coach begins the game by playing a pass to the yellow team with the advantage of 3 v 1 in their zone.



They must try and combine with each other to create a scoring opportunity. They can also pass to the yellow player in the other zone if they wish.

If the yellow team miss or score the coach then plays a pass to a red player in the other zone for that team to try and score.



If the red player was to win possession they must try and pass across into the other 'battle zone' for their teammates to try and score.

Keep score between the two teams to get a winner after 5/10 rounds each. Change roles and play again if desired.

Possible changes

If the red team within that 'battle zone' score a goal it counts as 1 point but if they were to pass back for their red teammate to score from the opposing zone it would score 3/5 points.

Play 3 v 2, 4 v 3 or any combination depending on numbers and ability of the group.
